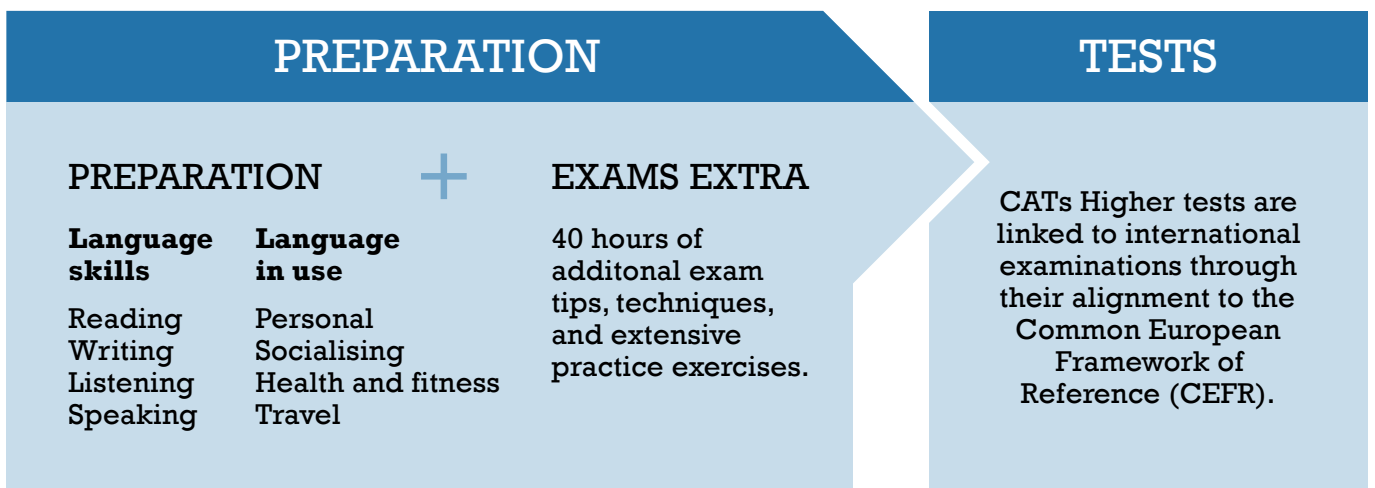




CATs Higher
